### **COVID-19 2020 Season Guidelines**

In order to facilitate ANY sail racing at South Shore Yacht Club (SSYC), the following rules will be enforced:

All participants including Competitors, RC Members and Spectators will adhere to the "Individual Guidelines For All Phases" as described in the State of Wisconsin Badger Bounce Back Plan. Specifically:

#### **CONTINUE TO PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE**

- Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer, especially after touching frequently used items or surfaces.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Sneeze or cough into a tissue or the inside of your elbow.
- Disinfect frequently used items and surfaces as much as possible.
- Strongly consider using cloth face coverings while in public, and particularly when using mass transit.

#### **PEOPLE WHO FEEL SICK MUST STAY AT HOME**

- Do NOT come to SSYC. Do NOT go to work, school, or any other public place.
- Contact and follow the advice of your medical provider.

#### **SSYC SPECIFIC SOCIAL DISTANCING RACING GUIDELINES**

- Face masks are not mandated but, for the sake of the health and safety of our Competitors, they are strongly recommended.
- Each Competitor, Race Committee Member or Spectator must be wearing a Personal Flotation Device (PFD) at ALL times while on the dock when competing in the DF65 Radio Controlled fleet.
- During set up, please keep distance between fellow Competitors and Race Committee members.

- A minimum of 6 feet will be required between Competitors, Race Committee members, and Spectators while on the dock.
- Once a DF65 starting sequence countdown has begun, the Competitor must remain in place and not move around.
- If a Competitor loses control of his or her boat, the Competitor shall alert the RC with a verbal or hand signal, identifying the boat. An RC volunteer will retrieve the boat. Retrieval may be delayed if the RC is in a starting sequence or taking finish times. The RC volunteer will place the boat on the dock at a socially safe location for pickup by the Competitor.

SSYC may revise these guidelines as more information is made available to the Race Committee that may require the need for change.

Competitors and Spectators will be attending and participating at their own risk. Each Competitor and Spectator assumes that risk and agrees that SSYC is not responsible for any injury, illness, or harm, even if fatal, arising from the negligent conduct of SSYC, including from the failure of SSYC or any other Competitor or Spectator to follow the Wisconsin State and Milwaukee County mandated guidelines.

These Guidelines apply to every Competitor in ANY sail racing fleet at SSYC during the 2020 Season, and they also apply to every Spectator. A "Spectator" is any person who in any fashion is watching, observing, attending or participating in racing (radio controlled or otherwise) at SSYC during the 2020 Season other than as a Competitor or as a designated member of the Race Committee.
